Fr. Hoover met with us; he was very quiet, subdued. I told im the reason we shad asked him to talk to us, repeated that we were asked to speak with shim because of the allegation of that it licove had sexually abused him over a period of a vear. when Tr Woover was assistant pastor at # I asked him to talk about what he knew and remembered.

FI. Hoover said that he had read the memorandum I had given Bishop Delaney and the facts there were in general true. He said that he had touched sexually during the period mentioned. At the say, though, that the details of what took place other than touching and magging did not, as he remembered, take place. He said that he had not committed fellatio on him, mor had he masturbated him.

Fr. Hoover said that he had been organised early, with Church permission, at the age of 23, that he was very impature, that he had worried about this incident over the years, that had not done this to any other person since then. That he had been successing in adjust mentally working with the carsillo Movement and other diocesan projects. He had eved he had matured after those incidents, that he was sorry that it happened.

When asked if anyons else shew about these occurrences, he said that he believed Bishop Gorman knew about it, that Fr. Fred Mosman who was his pastor at Holy Cross Church, Dallas (pollowing his 2 years at St. James) also knew about it. He didn't know of any others who had knowledge of it.

1. The meeting over-all went well. = was impressed and pleased that I wild called him and gone over 10 = 100 meet with him. Also, several very mistaken impression that had made him very angry over a cleared up.

- Treferred to the prof financial needs that he had given the committee and hoped that the Church could help him in this time of crisis. I told him that on behalf of the DoffW I could ofter annual and counseling as was necessary, but that was all. After a cound-about confersation on this point, it became clear that he was expecting much more—in line with the list of financial needs he had left with the committee. He insisted that he was not trying to extort in aney, but only that his life was in crisis and he needed help—and he feels that the crisis in part is the to the childhood abuse. Further conversation produced the amazing revelation that he had signed a hold-harmless agreement with the Diocese of Dallas last Friday and was paid the sum of \$5,000. When he met with Frs. Gardner and Bell at the chancery in Dallas, there was an attorney present. They had a document prepared that in its original form included the Doff-W, Frs. Hoover and Schumacher, as well as the Dallas people. He questioned why he was signing on FW, so they struck that part out and told him that he should approach us for further help. (In my conversation with Fr. Gardner this afternoon he left slip as an afterthought the fact that they

had given the \$5,000, which he said was for counseling, but never mentioned the attorney or the hold-harmless agreement. When I explained to: 1 that the Doff W had no liability for an act that occurred before the diocese even existed, he pondered this and then said something to the effect of them I've been had. This led to his become very angry with the Church as a whole and Dallas specifically.

- 4.— then said that of the couldn't sue either diocese, the would sue WH directly, and that would cause in great deal of that publicity and swould cost everybody at great deal. But he also kept ansisting (and I believe he is sincere) that he is not looking for a lot of more that only enough help to get him through the present crisis.

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Statement of Bishop Toseph P. Delaney
July 2, 1995

It is with great sadness that I make the following announcement.

Father William Hoover has resigned as pastor of Saint Patrick's Cathedral parish in Fort. Worth He has admitted the sexual abuse of a minor in an incident that occur at hearly 40 years ago. Knowledge of this matter came to the attention of diocesan officials here was ago when the person who was abused made the accusation against dather Hoover, in accord two diocesals guidelines, as committee was appointed to meet with that person and white lather Hoover. When he was presented with this accusation, Father Hoover acknowledged that it was true. When a complaint of this mature is found to be true, the care of the Catholic community requires that a still disclosure be made.

On behalf of the whole Church, Il offer that come our deep sympathy and profound apology for the suffering that has been caused by what pappened ago. The Diocese of Fort Worth stands ready to provide whatever consciing that be required to deal with this past abuse and to help that person cope with problems that may have resulted from that experience.

Father Hoover is on an indefinite leave of absence from active ministry. He will be undergoing an extensive psychological and spinistal evaluation and, if indicated, further therapy. When he was questioned by the anguiry committee Father Hoover was very forthright in ministring that there had been sexual contact with the boy but he disputed whether it has been as extensive as much earn reported. He denied that there had been any other such events. When I met with him, however, he told me that there had been a couple of other boys involved too. lince the original accuser has also indicated that there were other involved, we are pursuing that theter. Hither Hoover has assured me that nothing ever occurred again after that one year.

I met with the person making the accusation last week. He is an intelligent and articulate but unsophisticated , year-old, who is in very difficult straits-in danger of losing what little he has and of going to jail .. He insists that his asking for money is not extortion, but only justifiable assistance at this terrible time in his life. He thinks that the abuse he suffered was the cause of his present predicament. He was very angry with

Father Hoover and the Church and was threatening to make a major public issue of the matter at one apoint, and then later he was sorry for Father Hoover. I have offered him as much help with counseling as he wishes or is indicated, but no other recompense. (Actually, if the were further financial liability, it would fall to the Diocese of Dallas, since the abuse occurred in parish in the city of Dallas and this diocese did not exist at that time.) (Our attorney has concluded that it seems that there is no legal liability, either civil or criminal in this case because of the lapse of time. It is not unlikely, however, that the person will bring the analyser up during this trial as a unitigating circumstance to explain his present pathology.

This is the first time any hint of anything improper has ever been heard about Father Hoover. The news is causing profound shock and sadness throughout our diocese and beyond. My hope as that the assessment will do several things: Tirst give Father Hoover supported affirmation at this very critical time; secondly, provide us, insofar as it may be possible, with some assurance that indeed nothing improper has taken place since the reassigned to pressly and finally, provide some indication about whether he can ever be reassigned to pressly maistry, and if so, under what circumstances.





Concern: St. Patrick's Cathedral

Although hundreds of letters of support for Father Hoover came to the chancery, frany of them requesting that he be reassigned to the Cathedral, he and the Bishop have decided that it would be best for him not to return. Bishop Delaney has sent a letter to the Cathedral parishioners explaining this to them. He told them that even after all the sublicity there have been no further accusations of misconduct by Father Hoover and none occurring after 1960. Nevertheless, the harm done sometimes lingers for decades, and so counseling is being provided those who requested it. He asked the parishioners to pray for those who were hurt, some of whom are still hurting, and for Father Hoover, who assuredly has been hurt by all this. He will then dialog with the bishop abulier eassignment to ministry.

Therefore, if you are interested, you may request assignment as pastor of St. Patrick's Cathedral. Those who have already indicated an interest in St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish in Keller are not prohibited from volunteering for its Cathedral.

I want to express to you my deep graitude and admiration for the way an which you have realiwith the difficult situation involving Father William Hoover's resignation as justor of Saint Paurick's last month. In spite of the pain and disappointment you experienced, you have been, a model of Christian dignity and compassion for all no see.

I am also grateful to you for the many letters I have received from members of the parish sharing your sorrow with me and telling me of your prayers and support. I have been specially moved by your love for Father Hoover and your willingness to forgive what happened a long ago. He has received all your letters and they have been a great comfort to him at this wery difficult time in his life.

Many of you urged me to consider asking Father Hoover in return to Saint Patrick's. I have discussed this with him and we have concluded together that at this time it would not be in the best interest of either Saint Patrick's or of Father Hoover himself. Therefore, I am about to begin the process of selecting a new pastor in the usual way, by inviting interested priests to apply. I hope that I can announce the assignment within everal weeks.

Please continue to keep Father Hoover in your prayers. He will be away from the diocese in a counseling program for the new few amonths. When he and I first discussed the accusations against him, he admitte trimmediate atome that they were true and that several young men were involved, but that nothing dispensed as involved that time. Now, in spite of all the publicity, there have been no further accusant his of mis conduct by Father Hoover and none occurring after 1960. It is clear that his problem was said to rest a long time ago. Unfortunately, the results of our misdeeds of the state longer than we can foresee. Several innocent and vulnerable persons were deeply affected by that misconduct. They need our prayers and support. Those who have requested help are it reiving it.


