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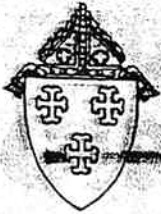

1. On Monday, November 2, 1998, at 4:30 pm., Monsignor Robert C. Evans received at telephone call at the Chancery from an individual who identified himself as of advised Monsignor Evans that he was calling in behalf of a friend and roommate

2. further advised Monsignor Evans that had a block on his telephone and could not call out and request that he be contacted by calling , regarding a matter involving a priest of the Providence Diocese.

3. Immediately on completion of this call, Monsignor Evans contacted this office regarding the matter. After a brief discussion with Monsignor Evans, I called , at the above number advised me that a little over thirty years ago, while a young child riding a bicycle in Worcester, Massachusetts, he got a flat tire. An individual who he later identified as Reverend Philip Magaldi, stopped to assist him. He further advised that he placed his bike in the trunk of the car and offered to give young a ride home.

4. further alleges, that instead of giving him a ride home, he took him to a hotel in Worcester that he identified as the Holiday Inn after dropping off his bike in his yard. then alleges that the individual who identified himself as a Priest brought him to a hotel room at the Holiday Inn and went through a mood change. stated that he began to talk "about sin and all sorts of real crazy stuff. I was scared...I told him I wanted to leave. He

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said I couldn't. Uhm, he never physically stopped me but I was scared of him, you know. I was maybe eight-five pounds. I was a real pip-squeak."

5. I then asked _____ what then happened? He replied, "He raped me. He ah, had this thing with enemas. Use to call it holy water. And he did it to me and then he...then he forcibly performed oral sex on me. Then he wanted me to do it to him and I couldn't." I then asked if this individual sodomized him? He responded, "Anal sex?" McCarthy, "Yes.", "Yes."

6. The following is a portion of the transcript of page five of an interview of _____ conducted on Sunday, November 29, 1998.

McCarthy Ah, besides sodomizing you he then performed oral sex on you.

After he sodomized me...

McCarthy Ah

...he wanted me to do it to him and I...I couldn't. I couldn't. You know, I

McCarthy Yup

I wasn't capable physically. And ah, I remember I was trying to get dressed. I remember he made me sit down on the bed and he...I don't know when I got the lecture about how I'd be removed from my family, this that and the other thing I think it was...might have been after. It might even have been before that, but he started performing oral sex on me and nothing would happen. I was totally freaked out, sort of. Uhm...

McCarthy How old would you have been at this time?

Fourteen, fifteen, maybe thirteen, I don't know. Maybe sixteen. I'm sorry...I don't know. I don't remember the year.

7. On page _____ of that same interview, _____ further relates the following.

Uhm, I guess when he realized that I wasn't able to do that, he made me give him an enema.

McCarthy Did he give you an enema?

Oh yeah. And he hurt me with it. I mean he wouldn't stop. And ah...

McCarthy Is this prior to the anal sex? Or after?

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Yeah, prior. That's right before he did the oral sex he made me do that to him. I was just like totally disgusted with it, you know, I was.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

But I was so afraid.

McCarthy Yup

I couldn't. There was no way I could. That's when he started performing oral sex on me. It was still no results.

8. I once again asked how he knew this individual was a Priest if he did not have clerical garb on, he related, "Oh yeah, he bragged about being an Priest. Uhm, and in the hotel room he showed me ah, the collar and all that stuff. He had all that stuff...It was sitting...uhm, he had a shirt, a jacket and stuff over a chair and there was one of the collars on the table."

9. further alleges that this individual that he has identified and Father Philip Magaldi would give him money after these sexual encounters that went on for several years. After this first encounter, he alleges that Father Magaldi gave him three hundred dollars cash.

10. stated "...But from that day on I couldn't even go to school. I had to smoke pot before I went to school, during school buy pills, whatever, and that money he gave me, that I have abused heroin and cocaine for more than twenty years in addition to alcohol and other drugs. He currently is in a program in

and stated that he is attempting to put his life back together and needs to come to terms with various issues in his life, and this is one of the biggest issues he is dealing with.

11. advised me that he wants to protect others from Father Magaldi, put closure on the matter, and join his and in is a year old who is currently unemployed and was

12. further alleges that this abuse with Father Magaldi went on for several years and during that time there was approximately a dozen and a half incidents. He related to me that these events ended when he went into the In all of these events, he states that Father Magaldi gave him money.

13. on earned money as a street prostitute in and during one evening he was sitting on the steps of the library hustling, and a vehicle stopped and it was Father Magaldi. He got in the vehicle and they had another sexual encounter.

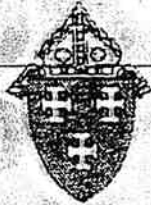

I received a letter today marked "strictly personal and confidential" from Bishop Robert Mulvee of Providence forwarding to me a memorandum written by Robert N. McCarthy, Director of the Office of Education and Compliance for the Diocese of Providence about accusations made against Father Philip Magaldi by [redacted]. A copy of these documents is attached.

After reading the material and discussing it with Father Robert Wilson, I called Mr. McCarthy and spoke to him. He explained that he had interviewed [redacted] in person and found him to be quite credible. He told me that there did not seem to be any immediate danger of publicity about the charges. He offered to send me by expedited mail a copy of the taped interview with [redacted] and the other materials he had pertaining to the case. He also offered to help in any way that he could, provided Bishop Mulvee was agreeable.

I told him that I would be back in touch with him after reviewing the materials.

The material from the Diocese of Providence arrived today from Robert McCarthy. Included were the tape of the interview he had with _____, a transcript of that tape, and the file of this incident from its beginning four weeks ago.

After listening to the tape, I convened the sub-committee (of the diocesan sexual misconduct group) that had heard the complaint against him in January, 1997. The members: Father Wilson, _____

The committee listened to most of the interview with me and then discussed the way to proceed. It was decided to meet with PM on Saturday, December 19 and let him hear the tape. Given the similarity to the incident 23 months ago, the committee discerns a pattern of misconduct reaching back many years. The outcome of the meeting may be removing PM from active ministry, sending him to Rhode Island for a polygraph test, and then to _____ for evaluation.

I am trying to reach Bishop Mulvey to discuss the matter with him and to ask for Robert McCarthy's assistance in having the accuser, _____ take the polygraph test and also setting it up for PM. I also want to discuss with the bishop the legal implications for his diocese so that we don't precipitate any difficulty for them.

The subcommittee of the Sexual Misconduct Board comprised of Father Wilson, _____ d _____ met with me and Father Philip Magaldi today in my office at the Catholic Center. There is a tape recording of the session.

Briefly, PM listened to the tape of the interview Robert McCarthy of the Diocese of Providence had with _____ on November 29. After hearing the tape, PM denied that any of it was true and that he had never met or even heard of a person named _____. When confronted by members of the committee with the similarities between the incident two years ago (involving enemas) and the allegations by _____, PM admitted that it was a strange coincidence, but refused to admit anything more. After some discussion PM left the room and the committee conferred.

The resulting decisions were then presented to PM: 1) that the committee could not discount the allegations; 2) that PM needed to be interviewed by Robert McCarthy and submit to a polygraph test; 3) that PM would go to _____ on January 3 for a psychological evaluation. The committee would then review the results of these steps sometime in early January and make further recommendations.

As regards PM's ministry. Since it is only a few days before Christmas, since there is no foreseen danger to any other persons, since the investigation of the allegations is still underway, and since precipitate action could affect the good name of both PM and the Diocese, it was decided that PM may continue in ministry for the next week through December 27.

I will call _____ to set up the assessment scheduled for January 3-7. I plan attend the final session of the evaluation on January 7.

I will call Robert McCarthy to see if he can interview PM between December 28 and 31, and arrange at the same time for a polygraph test. I will also ask his permission to give a copy of the transcript of the _____ interview to _____.

I will call for another meeting of the subcommittee when the results of these steps are ready for review. It is understood by all that PM will not be involved in active ministry after December 27 until the matter is finally settled.

2. I spoke with Bishop Mulvey to ask if he would allow Robert (Rocket) McCarthy to help us follow up on _____ allegations. He was very agreeable, but he insisted that any interviews that Rocket would have with PM or _____ should take place in Massachusetts, to avoid confusion with jurisdiction.

3. I spoke with Robert McCarthy to tell him of Bishop Mulvey's permission for him to help us. He will set up a meeting with PM in Massachusetts and arrange for a polygraph test for both PM and _____.

4. I spoke with PM and gave him the contact numbers for _____ and for McCarthy. He will call them both and make arrangements. He will go to Rhode Island on the 28th and stay at the family house. He will make his own travel arrangements.

5. McCarthy called me later in the morning with some problems about the polygraph. Since PM is an employee of the diocese, federal laws protecting employees come into play. I promised to call _____ and have them speak together.

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McCarthy This is ah, Case Number It's Wednesday, December 30, 1998.

It's 10:00 a.m. We're at the Office of Education and Compliance in Providence, Rhode Island, and we're interviewing Father Philip A. Magaldi. And Father, are you the Pastor?

Fr. Magaldi I'm Associate Pastor.

McCarthy Associate Pastor of Saint John The Apostle Church located in Fort Worth, Texas. And we're here to ah, discuss some allegations that were made on November 2, 1998, by an individual who identified himself as

Fr. Magaldi I never heard that name, and I do not know any person by that name.

McCarthy Ah, alleges in his complaint that he first had contact with you when he was a juvenile in the City of Worcester, Massachusetts. Did you have any occasions to go to Worcester?

Fr. Magaldi I've been in Worcester. I could count the number of times on my hand.

The only times that I went to Worcester were to go to the ah, Toomey Religious Goods ah, Company.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Normally with the late ah, Father Joe Merluzzo, who was a close friend of mine and my predecessor at Saint Anthony's, and ah, I'm not sure if Father Bourdon or Father Bucci from the Diocese. I never went up to that Company by myself. First of all I would always get lost if I tried to go

alone. But really the only time that I was ever in Worcester was for that reason ah, to purchase ah, religious goods.

McCarthy So you never ran across ah, an individual...

Fr. Magaldi No, never.

McCarthy ...who later identified himself as ?

Fr. Magaldi No. No Sir.

McCarthy He would have been a teenager at the time.

Fr. Magaldi Yes, I understand that, but I...I never ever had occasion to meet anybody by that name.

McCarthy says on his complaint that he was in the City or Worcester near Kelly Square. He was riding a bicycle ah, and as he was riding the

bicycle ah, he broke ah, the rim. So he had to push his bike along, and

he said that as he had...ah was walking pushing his bike, a vehicle

Fr. Magaldi I have no idea. I really don't remember. I know it's the R... I think it's called R.J. Toomey. They have like a factory.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm, showroom, and...and we'd go there occasionally. I went to buy a cassock, which you don't buy very often, or these ah, these collars, which

also you could get at ah, Tally's downtown, our religious goods store, but sometimes they wouldn't have the size, and that would be the only reason that we would go up there.

McCarthy He says he didn't know that this person was a priest cause he was wearing civilian attire. He said that ah, you did though mention that you were a Priest, even though you weren't dressed one, and he says you even bragged about it.

Magaldi Yeah, that's...that's what I don't understand.

McCarthy And he says that ah, you appeared to be a nice guy, and as a result of that ah, he said that ah, you went to a Holiday Inn in the City of Worcester, and at the Holiday Inn he said that's where he saw the roman collar sitting on a table.

Fr. Magaldi Ah ha (inaudible words)

McCarthy He said and in that room your mood changed radically. He said you started talking about sin and what he quotes is and I'm gonna quote him, "All sorts of real crazy stuff. I was scared." Never took place?

Fr. Magaldi No. This...all I can say is that this whole thing is fabrication. I have some strong suspicions, but I don't know if this is the place to interject them or not.

McCarthy Sure, go ahead.

Fr. Magaldi You said that you were involved with Massachusetts, the State Police and so forth?

McCarthy Uhm hrom, correct.

Fr. Magaldi Did you ever come across a name or person, ?

McCarthy ?

Fr. Magaldi Yes.

McCarthy How do you spell that?

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

Fr. Magaldi Nope.

Fr. Magaldi Okay, well I thought that he was involved with people in the Attorney General's Office for one reason or another. Questions of him possibly being a drug dealer. Ah, he...

McCarthy What are you saying, he's a...was a confidential informer?

Fr. Magaldi The reason I bringing him up...I don't know for sure.

McCarthy Okay.

Fr. Magaldi I'm bringing it up because he was involved in the famous VonBulow case in which I also was involved. I don't know if you've got any background about all of that. Ah, it turned out that ah, he had told me some things about bringing drugs to Newport, that when this story of Von Bulow came out I told him that he had to give this information to the authorities or else I would have to, and it turned out that ah, he went to talk to Alan Dershowitz and I'm not sure in this thing ah, this ah, interview that you had, the name Dershowitz came up. But I...

McCarthy He said he was talking to an attorney on The next thing he

knows he's on a ah, three way line conversation, and the guy ah, that identifies himself as Attorney Dershowitz of Boston, begins to tell him that he should not meet with me in this office and that ah, he shouldn't meet with anybody without meeting with them first.

Fr. Magaldi Oh!

McCarthy Ah, that's what he alleges in the conversation.

Fr. Magaldi I would question that, because I talked to Alan Dershowitz yesterday. He never heard of this guy. That's the first thing. Secondly, when I'm getting back to in the middle of the Von Bulow Trial, the uhm, I guess it was the uhm, Appeal Trial, because he was convicted of attempting to murder his wife with insulin.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi And then Dershowitz had ah, a retrial or a ah, appeal trial. Okay?

McCarthy Uhm hmmm.

Fr. Magaldi But the point is that in the middle of this got angry with the Von Bulow situation and...and Dershowitz and held a big press conference on his own in saying that the whole thing was a lie that the Affidavit was a lie, that I had drawn, cooked up the affidavit with VonBulow, and I had never even had known VonBulow before. That's another whole case, but the reason I'm bringing up this, cause this wanted me to say that, yes, I knew that this was a lie. And I said I said that, because it...you told me that you had brought drugs to a...a place in Newport.

Magaldi And at that time I had told you...this was a couple of years before the thing even came out.

McCarthy So what does got to do with .?

McCarthy Excuse me Father, I just want to turn this off. The secretary's on a break.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy Okay Father, you were saying.

Magaldi Ah, with these tapes, one of which he had made with my voice saying...ah, he talk/saying to me, you know that this whole thing is a lie from beginning to end, and then there's a pause, and then my voice is heard to say I know it, Well I know I said I know it, I know it, lots of times to get rid of him off the phone. She sent the...and I was then on the day that the jury was going into sequestration or whatever they do.

McCarthy To being sequestered

Fr. Magaldi For...from...they were at the Holiday Inn I believe.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Here in Providence. That Sunday the Boston Globe had a big thing that Priest indicted for perjury in VonBulow Case.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Which we thought as a calculated thing to dissuade the jury, but anyway it didn't. But the point is she then proceeded to charge me with perjury and I was going to have to go on trial for perjury. A few days...she sent the tapes to an independent laboratory in New Jersey, and they sent back a

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report saying that these tapes could never be used in Court because they had been doctored or they had been redone over something.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Then with that, two days before I was suppose to go on trial the charges were dropped and the headline says, "State Drops Charges Against Father Magaldi." Well anyway, resented that and threatened that he would destroy me somehow, okay. At one point he came down

Saturday night to Mass and passed out flyers to the Congregation coming out of Church, saying that I was a pathological liar, that I was a homosexual, that I was...that I... I took kids out to meals and vacations and all this kind of stuff.

McCarthy Where were you assigned at the time?

Fr. Magaldi At that time I was at Saint Anthony's in...in North Providence. When this alleged stuff supposedly took place I was an Assistant at uhm, Saint Matthew's down the Street here on Elmwood Avenue. I was Monsignor Brennan's Assistant...one of his three Assistants. Another thing.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi While I'm at it. I'm sorry, I just...

McCarthy Sure, go ahead.

Fr. Magaldi ...bubble up all this stuff.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

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Fr. Magaldi

Now I was in charge of altar servers. I had 188 altar servers, okay. That's one thing I have been proud for my whole life. I've had over 2,000 altar servers, and if...if everyone of them was lined up and put their hand on the Bible, not one of them would ever say or could say that I molested them or even suggested anything improper. I loved my work. In fact six priests of the Diocese were my former altar boys, one of which was Monsignor Evans. Okay, ah, where I was Mount...Mount Carmel with Monsignor Cavallaro. Anyway ah

I said these people want to have a...an audience with you and he, you know, he was willing to see them. And I don't know if I ever knew that I was the one that...because after that he was taken out and sent to another parish or something. That's why I'm just wondering if something...I don't deny that something like this could have happened to this young man, but it wasn't from me. Is it possible somebody else used my name?

McCarthy

How did he get the name?

Fr. Magaldi

That's why...

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McCarthy I guess anything's possible. I asked him to describe you. He says ah, the best I can describe it...I'm quoting now:

Fr. Magaldi Yeah.

McCarthy "Dark hair, a little bit over weight. The rest is a blur." I asked him...

Fr. Magaldi Did he say anything about glasses or anything, cause...

McCarthy Nope. I asked him...

Fr. Magaldi I never had glasses at that time.

McCarthy ...ah, when he got to the hotel, what took place.

Fr. Magaldi Before you do that.

McCarthy Sure.

Fr. Magaldi May I ask you one other question?

McCarthy Absolutely.

Fr. Magaldi Did he say anything about seeing this article that was a month or two ago in the Worcester paper? You see what happened was...

McCarthy Uhm hhm.

Fr. Magaldi I understand of this Father Teczar, who was originally in Worcester and then at some point went to Fort Worth, and then left Fort Worth. Okay?

McCarthy Uhm hhm.

Fr. Magaldi And went elsewhere, that there was a trial beginning. Now the Dallas News picked that up.

McCarthy That's correct.

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Fr. Magaldi And associated me with Father Teczar, being one of two priests that Bishop Delaney had hired after checkered pasts, like especially with my...with embezzlement thing.

McCarthy Uhm:hmm.

Fr. Magaldi And that article had innuendoes in it, again from the...taken from the Rhode Island papers at the time because of and all that, that I had taken boys on vacation, which I had ah, that I had taken kids out to dinner and stuff like that, and there was a big reaction, not only in the Parish, but by Bishop Delaney that it was wrong to associate me with Father Teczar, that my problems were known in Fort Worth when I went there. We told the Parish. He had it in the Diocesan newspaper and that no charges or allegations of sexual misconduct had ever come up about me. This is the first...the first thing that... that I ever heard. So now my question is did this guy look or see this article in the newspaper and get an idea that this could be the Priest because ah, I just don't understand his his rationale, you know, that he...that he knows that name. How is it that he never used this name to anybody about all these years? That's another thing.

McCarthy Uhm:hmm.

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Fr. Magaldi But I should...I think I'm jumping ahead because there's some other things in there as we go along. But what I'm saying is I'm questioning whether there's a possibility that could be behind this, because here's another thing...

McCarthy I think there's always a question of a possibility on anything.

Fr. Magaldi Especially if he was dealing with drugs and all that. But I need to let you know something else too. All right, shortly ah, when all this business came up with me at Saint Anthony's ah, about the ah, embezzlement.

McCarthy Uhm hhm.

Fr. Magaldi Okay? The first thing to remember here is that the Diocese of Providence never said that I embezzled. They said that I had misused the funds that I had ah, that I had intermingled funds, and this is what happened.

However, I also...I know I was guilty of paying people in cash. Ah, when I was a young priest, the Pastors I was with always paid the housekeeper, the sexton, anybody who was on Social Security in cash. So that's one way that I had learned. Okay?

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McCarthy Uhm hhm.

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Fr. Magaldi So that they wouldn't have to pay extra taxes. Right or wrong, in paying people cash, it was necessary for me to write checks to cash in order to have that money to pay them. Now:

Oh God, I can't think of her last name, _____ Anyway she came from _____ and she was ah, going through _____ Her...the organist came to me and said, her _____

If he can prove that she's getting a check from the Church ah, they will reduce his payments and all that. Can you pay her in cash?

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi And I said okay. Now this amounted to like Three Hundred Dollars a week, cause

Okay? Now, when this investigation took place of an audit and everything over a three year period because the finances were in...in array at Saint Anthony's

Okay ah, that three hundred dollars a week for her...

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi ...came out to Fifteen Thousand Dollars a year times three years. That

was Forty-five Thousand Dollars there that was in cash, and I'm sure, she would not come forward and do this in a court of law, but she might do this if somebody asked privately, and several other people, one

of whom...two of whom were relatives of Father Stephan Silpigni, who's also a friend of mine. But, what I'm trying to get at is this, when the

Diocese found that I was not paying the tax bills on time they wanted to know how come, because everything with Saint Anthony's was supposed to be a great Parish. I had brought the festival from a Thousand Dollar

profit to a Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars just before I left. We had...we had a wonderful response. I've had no problem with people

anywhere I was at. But, it was wonderful. The thing is I, unfortunately in my, you know, psychological profile I had one said that he thinks he acts

more with the heart than with the head. Ah, I was on my own. Bishop Gelineau said I made myself a king, and there was only room in the

Diocese for one king; him, I know that. And I agreed. I made mistakes in doing that, but I kept saying I did not steal that money. That money went

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to people. The Attorney General at that time ah, (inaudible name) who's now a Judge, was trying to make a name for himself and I...I do not deny that ah, I was a white collar...you know, like I just heard about Governor DiPrete and stuff.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi So naturally they were...they were going after everybody. Uhm, the thing is they...the Diocese came up with the conclusion that I intermingled

funds, which I had done. When I wanted to do something, when I got to that Church I was brand new as a Pastor in 1976. I wanted to ah, do some things. The rectory, I didn't like the way the house was. And I said

how can I ask the people to do this. I had money of my own from my dad from my aunt who had died, and I used some of that money. I put that money into the church so I could do what I wanted. But then as time went on and I wanted to do more things, I...what I did was I asked som...

for one person who use to own

Now it's

He sold it to somebody. He was

Okay? And I would go to him and say, I need Ten Thousand Dollars. He'd say okay. Now he couldn't make it out to the Church, because it would have to go in the Church books and they would say where...how did I...I knew you're not suppose to borrow money off the Bishop, more than Twenty-five Hundred I think it was at the time; I don't know if it's gone up now, without the Bishop's approval, so I was acting on my own. Okay?

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McCarthy No, he or I should say

Fr. Magaldi No, when I'm supposed to have attacked him and all that.

McCarthy He said it began...yes, he was living with his family.

Fr. Magaldi And there's something there that says I called him at his house to tell him to meet me on several occasions. I remember reading something like that...

McCarthy Uhm hhm.

Fr. Magaldi ...in that. That...it makes no sense at all where were his parents in all...

McCarthy He said that he had a very ah, rocky relationship with his parents that could best be described as a dysfunctional family.

Fr. Magaldi (Inaudible words)

McCarthy And he was not close with his parents at all.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, but he never would say anything if...if he was raped...raped in the sense that I think everybody understands that.

McCarthy Uhm hhm.

Fr. Magaldi Would he not have had to go to a doctor or something for some kind of damage to himself, to his body, or tell his parents about it, or anything?

McCarthy I said that...I ah, specifically said to him why he never reported it to either his parents or the police. His response is I was a druggie. I was always beamed out on drugs, number one. How can I go to the police on that, and number two, he said I sold drugs and did drugs. You know, the last thing I wanted to come into contact with was the police.

Fr. Magaldi Sure.

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McCarthy But what...I didn't want to cut you short.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy What does that have to do with ?

Fr. Magaldi Nothing...nothing, but what I'm trying to ah, explain is that all of these...some of this stuff seems to, because I was guilty or I pleaded guilty and went to prison, they think ah, he must be this person.

McCarthy So you're...you're saying because of a...a prior embezzlement conviction this has surfaced, the sexual assault.

Fr. Magaldi No, no, no no no no, this was included in that article (inaudible words) because he refers to this. How would he know about any of this if he

didn't read it in the article?

McCarthy Oh, I see what you're saying.

Fr. Magaldi Okay. All right. That's what...my feeling is that...

McCarthy And so what is...

Fr. Magaldi ...he may have been...

McCarthy What are you alleging then is motivating him to make this complaint?

Fr. Magaldi I feel...

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi That what...he did mention in there something about being behind in...in...in support payments.

McCarthy Yes he is.

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Fr. Magaldi To his kids and stuff like that. Ah, maybe there's a connection between what happened in the Diocese of Dallas next to us where the Diocese was

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sued for so many million dollars, and...and that went all over the country,
that information.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Ah, then...and it was common knowledge I guess that...that some of these
people got money because of having been molested by different priests
that they had.

McCarthy Is...

Fr. Magaldi Maybe he got the idea that this was an opportunity for him.

McCarthy Here's what he says happened.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy I asked him to recall to the best of his recollection what took place at the
Holiday Inn in Worcester, and this is what he says, now I'm quoting him:

"He raped me. He has this thing with enemas. He use to call it holy
water, and he did it to me and then he forcibly performed oral sex on
me. Then he wanted me to do it to him, and I couldn't."

Fr. Magaldi I can state that that is an absolute lie.

McCarthy Absolutely.

Fr. Magaldi I have not performed oral sex on anybody.

McCarthy He then said...

Fr. Magaldi Or the other kind of sex. This...

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McCarthy I said to him ah, what took place for the rape to have occurred. I asked
him did he sodomize him. His response, "anal sex." He says that after
being sodomized ah, you then performed oral sex on him, and this is

what — says now. He says, "after he sodomized me he wanted me to do it to him, and I couldn't...I couldn't, you know, I couldn't. I wasn't capable physically and ah, I remember I was trying to get dressed. I remember he made me sit down on the bed and he ah, I don't know when I got the lecture about how I'd be removed from my family; this that and other things. I think it was...it might have been after. It might even have been before that, but he started performing oral sex on me and nothing would happen. I was like totally freaked out, sort of. I asked him how old he was at the time. He said, "fourteen, maybe thirteen, maybe sixteen." He said, "I don't remember exactly." But he said, "it was close to the mid-seventies when this event occurred." Now in the mid seventies

where were you assigned.?

Fr. Magaldi I was at Saint Matthew's from 1969 until 1976, just after my father died. I was appointed...in fact it was November of 1976, that I was appointed Pastor of Saint Anthony's.

McCarthy — says

Fr. Magaldi How do I do anything but deny that? That is a complete lie, absolute lie.

McCarthy He says further and I'm quoting him again, "Uhm, I guess he realized that I wasn't able to do that. He made me give him an enema."

Fr. Magaldi Oh (inaudible word)

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McCarthy I asked him, did you give him an enema or did he give you an enema, or did both occur? responds, "Oh yeah, he hurt me with it. I mean he wouldn't stop." My question to him is this prior to or after anal sex.

response, "Yeah, prior. That's right before the oral sex he made me do that to him. I was just totally disgusted with it." Now, did that ever occur?

Fr. Magaldi No, it did not.

McCarthy Tell me, did you have a recent incident involving an enema in Texas?

Fr. Magaldi A recent incident?

McCarthy Several years ago regarding a male who alleges ah, doing enemas with you?

Fr. Magaldi I did, but that...this was not a sexual thing. What had did this come from the Diocese of ah...

McCarthy Of what?

Fr. Magaldi Fort Worth?

McCarthy Yes. Did you have an incident there?

Fr. Magaldi I...it's not...it was not an incident.

McCarthy What happened?

Fr. Magaldi This...what happened was that I had had some polyps removed.

McCarthy Uhm hmn.

Fr. Magaldi From my colon, and part of the after thing was to have an enema on three...three or four occasions in the course of the week, and I was going to get...I mean who was I going to get to, you know, to help me with that, and I was going to get one of those ah, male nurses from the hospital or...

McCarthy Uhm hmn.

Fr. Magaldi You know. And they wanted like thirty-five or forty dollars ah, like a district nurse or something to do that.

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McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi And it just happened that there was ah, a young man who was coming to Church. He was in his twenties. He was gonna go to school
I think it was.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Okay? And he was a nice kid and...and we had become fairly friendly over the course of the...of the summer, and he had gotten a job ah, selling knives for some company, and I had bought some to help him. He...he was struggling with...some money.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi So, I guess it was kind of stupid and like the Bishop said, it wasn't prudent of me, but I didn't think anything of it because there was nothing sexual involved. I told him that I needed to have some help with this procedure, and if he was willing to do that rather than me paying somebody thirty-five dollars that I didn't even know, I'd be happy to give it to him.

McCarthy Did he help you with that procedure?

Fr. Magaldi Yes he did.

McCarthy How many occasions?

Magaldi I think it was three or four, but that was the...there was never any sexual connotation to that at all. And this is...this is part of the problem why it may seem credible uhm, to this other thing with this...this person.

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McCarthy said to me, if anybody talks to you about Father Philip Magaldi and enemas, you better listen. Listen real hard, cause he has this thing with enemas, and he calls it holy water.

Fr. Magaldi Now see that...that to me is...is sacrilegious.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi To say that.

McCarthy I agree.

Fr. Magaldi It really is. I would never...see I...I don't know.

McCarthy You have to admit there is a coincidence here.

Fr. Magaldi I...I know. I understand that.

McCarthy Two males, both allege enemas.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, but the...the other one is not alleging that I gave him an enema.

McCarthy No no.

Fr. Magaldi Or forced anything on him or (inaudible words)

McCarthy Only this guy.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy Now, subsequent to the incident that took place in Texas.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah.

McCarthy With the enemas, did you in turn go to to meet with this guy?

Fr. Magaldi When...you mean the boy that was from Texas?

McCarthy Yeah.

Fr. Magaldi I didn't go to to meet with him. I had to go to with...I went back to Rhode Island with my mom, and we left from and I called

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him to invite him to dinner with my mother and me at the uhm, at the
Hilton

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi Because he was going to

McCarthy Did he go?

Fr. Magaldi He came, but he didn't come to dinner. He came to have dessert. All he
came was for coffee and...and ah, uhm pie I guess.

McCarthy And then what happened?

Fr. Magaldi And then he had to leave. He had to go back to...

McCarthy Did you attempt to kiss him?

Fr. Magaldi I...they want to say that too, yes I kissed him. On the cheek, not on the
lips. On the cheeks like Ital...I'm Ital... Well I shouldn't use this excuse but
I'm Italian.

McCarthy Uhm hnm.

Fr. Magaldi But it was not a sexual thing at all. Now if he misinterpreted it like I think
you did ah, I guess that's his...

McCarthy But does that support _____ allegations. Now _____ has absolutely no
idea about that.

Fr. Magaldi I know. I know that.

McCarthy When I spoke to _____ he was so choked up and crying that ah, when I
first spoke with him ah, every other word he'd just break down.

Fr. Magaldi How did he...

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McCarthy He says that as a result of that initial encounter, he's had other encounters with you.

Fr. Magaldi Ah ha.

McCarthy He said that you paid him money.

Fr. Magaldi I know.

McCarthy Like the other guy alleges.

Fr. Magaldi Some fantastic amount like three hundred dollars.

McCarthy Three hundred, but he said, "He became a cheap bastard towards the end and only gave me fifty."

Fr. Magaldi First of all, when I was at Saint Andrew at ah, down the Street here at Saint Matthew's, the Assis... the pay I think it was about around dollars a month. How could I possibly have given him dollars of a month's salary.

McCarthy He says he doesn't know. Maybe that's where the money disappeared ah, in Rhode Island.

Fr. Magaldi See that the money in Rhode Island came up in 1988.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi This was back supposedly in the 70's.

McCarthy Cause I asked him specifically that.

Fr. Magaldi I had no contact with money in any Parish con... I had no...I was not in charge of money here at all at...at Saint uhm, Matthew's.

McCarthy But you gotta admit this is another coincidence. The guy from Texas gets money.

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Fr. Magaldi But I...I had money. I have money.

McCarthy And now alleges the same thing, money.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, but it's...the coincidence is not the same. I mean the fact of money...this boy needed money in...in Texas, and I was helping him like I have helped a lot of kids.

McCarthy This is what says: "From that day on I couldn't even go to school. I had to smoke pot before I went to school, during school buy pills, whatever, and that money that he gave me is what I used it for." Then tells me that he has for more than twenty years in addition.

Fr. Magaldi Ah ha

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McCarthy He said that he got a He was / and ah, he was and that's why he got. He said he ended up back in Worcester and became a male prostitute, a street hustler. He said one evening he was sitting on the li

(END OF SIDE ONE, TAPE ONE)

McCarthy A vehicle stopped, and he said he looked in the car and it was Father Magaldi. He said he got in the vehicle and they had a consensual sexual encounter.

Fr. Magaldi What year was this?

McCarthy This was after his return from the military.

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Fr. Magaldi Do you know when that was?

McCarthy I'd have to go back through his transcript there to get you that.

Fr. Magaldi Because there was a period that I was in Rome. I'd like to know when this is suppose to have taken place. This is in the seventies or the sixties?

McCarthy When were you in Rome?

Fr. Magaldi I was in Rome and on the faculty of the North American College for 1969 and '70. I'm sorry, '68 and '69, I guess it was.

McCarthy Okay. Ah, he says as a result of this sexual abuse ah, he is

He said that when he was he was arrested by the

is a matter of fact the guy who

worked for me.

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Fr. Magaldi Uhm hmm.

McCarthy It's a small world, huh?

Fr. Magaldi He was...what was he doing?

McCarthy Ah, he had ah...

Fr. Magaldi After the you mean?

McCarthy Correct. And he was ah...

Fr. Magaldi Yup. I'd like...to ask one question if I could.

McCarthy Sure.

Fr. Magaldi When these alleged things were happening to him, was he living at home with his parents?

McCarthy He said this went on for a few years.

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Fr. Magaldi That's what I'm saying, he was living at home with his parents?

McCarthy In addition to that he said ah, there was no love relationship between ah,
my family and me; that this was a dysfunctional family, and I was afraid...

Fr. Magaldi But he was a _____ when he was supposedly thirteen or fourteen. I
thought it said he became a _____ after.

McCarthy That's right. He says he did that with the money that you provided him
with.

Fr. Magaldi I don't...you see this is...this is the problem...All of us have said the same
thing. How do we defend ourselves against an allegation. Somebody
could go out of the Confessional and say Father touched me in the
Confessional or...or Monsignor King, we are all...we even had to put glass
on.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi ...things in the Confessional doors and to where we would interview
people just because there's been so many...even some of the
non-Catholic ministers have been accused.

McCarthy

Fr. Magaldi One guy not too far from where I am ah, supposedly was counseling four
women and raped them all.

McCarthy I said to him, what do you want from this? And ah...

Fr. Magaldi What did he say? Some...some...some help for his ah, child support or
something.

McCarthy I met with him on Sunday, November 29, 1998, at ten o'clock in

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When I asked him what he was looking for, he stated I

have a drug and alcohol problem and I need treatment. And when I was in treatment my counselor said to me that I have to get all my demons behind me. And he said that in dealing with the demons, this is the biggest one that he had to deal with. And so in order to beat alcohol and drug abuse, he's gonna have to deal with it. So, after he contacted Monsignor Evans to make this complaint he said that he relapsed into drugs again, and as a result of relapsing he went to

, where he is in an extensive program. He says the only thing I want out of this is to deal with it. This is the way the counselors told me I have to deal with this. I have to deal with it head on.

Fr. Magaldi Did he tell the counselors about me?

McCarthy That's what he said.

Fr. Magaldi Somebody suggested to him?

McCarthy No, he says that's what he said to the counselors. The counselor said he has to deal with that and one of those ways is by reporting it. That's what caused him to report it, not an article in the paper. And he said that all he wants is to be able to go back to his who's now his who lives in and he has there that he has for (inaudible words) of time.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hmm.

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McCarthy And he wants to go back and be the father that they never had. And he said in order to do that, he said I want to be able to deal with all of these demons and this is the biggest one. They told me that I have to report it,

and that's my reason for reporting it. He said secondly, he said uhm, I don't want what happened to me to happen to anybody else by Magaldi. And he said I want Church Authority to know that. He said I have no desire to sue the Church or Magaldi or anybody. All I want is the activity to stop and for me to get my life together and to go back to _____ with my

Fr. Magaldi—What activity to stop? I've been a Priest for thirty-eight years.

McCarthy He's alleging...

Fr. Magaldi Is it possible that if I was sick like that, that after that alleged incident I could be free of all problems with anybody else?

McCarthy I don't know if I'm qualified... I don't know if I'm qualified.

Fr. Magaldi I would like...that's why I'm going for this ah, evaluation thing to...to prove that there's nothing wrong with my head at all or my behavior.

McCarthy I said to _____ ah, what could be done to enhance the believability of your allegations, because at this point it's a he said/she said allegation?

And he said, I'll take a polygraph. I said we have the capabilities of doing that, _____. He said you tell me when and where and I'll be there.

Fr. Magaldi I said the same thing to Bishop Delaney.

McCarthy You told Bishop Delaney...

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Fr. Magaldi I told Bishop Delaney that when I...I would absolutely. I welcome the opportunity to do that. Then, two days later the Diocesan Lawyer called me and said, wait a minute, according to Federal Law or something.

McCarthy Uhm hmh.

Fr. Magaldi An employer cannot request an employee to do that.

McCarthy He is correct.

Fr. Magaldi And I said, well he's not really...he mentioned this guy's gonna do it. And I immediately said I do it. He said, well you can do it voluntarily. He said however, he has no right to the results of that test either.

McCarthy That's correct.

Fr. Magaldi I...I...see I don't know that business of the law. I don't understand why. I mean I need to have that known.

McCarthy Well because I guess there's a question as to whether Priests are employees or independent contractors.

Fr. Magaldi Well, the IRS has...use to have us as independent contractors.

McCarthy Yeah.

Fr. Magaldi Now we are employees. I think we get a W-2 Form and all that or 1040.

McCarthy I...

Fr. Magaldi But the point still is how absolutely sure are polygraph tests. Suppos'in the thing shows that we're both telling the truth. Suppose they think we're both telling the truth.

McCarthy Let me tell you what we normally do.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy First of all, the results of the polygraph are sent directly to the person who's polygraphed or their attorney, not to me.

Fr. Magaldi Oh.

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McCarthy In the event that you decide you want to release that to me, that's up to you. Number two, I am not present when the test is given.

Fr. Magaldi No.

McCarthy Number three, the test consists of maybe three or four questions. The people that I use are all certified nationally. Ah, one guy is Lieutenant Jack Consigli. He's in charge of the Polygraph Unit in the State Police. Ah, he has a computerized polygraph that scores independently of him.

We also use ah, a former State Police Officer Jack Nasuti who does all kinds of polygraphs for various attorneys. He was a polygraph examiner when he was on the job. I also use a guy by the name of Gus Amore who's a retired Lieutenant from the Rhode Island State Police and became the head of security at Citizens Bank, and he also polygraphs for various police departments and lawyers.

Fr. Magaldi Where do they do this?

McCarthy Now ah, well this is my next point. When we give the polygraph test ah, we give it in a neutral ground. Ah, you'd probably know the questions in advance. Ah...

Fr. Magaldi Who makes up the questions?

McCarthy Probably I would and the polygrapher.

Fr. Magaldi Right.

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McCarthy Ah, I would sit down and discuss the case with the polygrapher and pick three or four points I thought were important, that would require either a yes or a no response. Ah, what I also do is that I have and pay for a

second polygraph examiner to be present who doesn't give the exam but writes to me and has notarized ah, independent review of the exam, if it meets all the prescribed items that have to be done etc., etc. Based on that, their training and experience, you know how would they rate this.

Ah, that comes in independently of the other one, so he has no idea.

Fr. Magaldi: Uhm hmm.

McCarthy: What's coming in. And I just... I don't have any one specific.

just... whoever the next guy available and out of the box. Ah, with

is currently in

I don't think

it would be prudent at this point to polygraph him while he's a patient

there. I've spoken to him and he has asked ah, once again to take the polygraph upon his release from that program. He's there to a maximum of ninety days, but it's... it could be even less than that, dependent upon...

Fr. Magaldi: Ninety days from now or?

McCarthy: No, ninety days from when he entered.

Fr. Magaldi: Oh, which is when?

McCarthy: Ah, I don't know. I'd to go back and look at the file.

Fr. Magaldi: (Inaudible words)

McCarthy: But it was... I'll give you a ballpark figure. It was at the beginning of December. So...

Fr. Magaldi: So he certainly can... he could be there until February?

McCarthy: He could be.

Fr. Magaldi: Is there any chance that any of this is gonna get into the newspapers?

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McCarthy I would say at this point not from this Office, number one. Number two, if
is to be believed about his ah, desires ah, I would say probably
not. Ah...

Fr. Magaldi He has not contacted...you said he contacted an attorney though?

McCarthy He said that his roommate, as well as ah, some of the people
being treated there, have told him that he should be talking to an attorney.
He said he talked to an attorney. He did not identify him.

He says as a result of his conversation with the attorney, he next knows
he's on a party line and he's talking with an individual who identifies
himself as Alan Dershowitz. He said they tell him not to meet with

McCarthy and ah, meet only with them. He says to me then I'm not
interested in suing the Church. That's all they're interested in is getting
one third of the pie. He said all I want is to deal with this so I can get back
to with

Fr. Magaldi Fine.

McCarthy That's all I want.

Fr. Magaldi If I...

McCarthy And...

Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy And I don't want Magaldi ah, doing this to anybody else and they have to
go through what I did.

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Fr. Magaldi He doesn't have to worry about that, because I never did it to him and I
never did it to anybody else.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Secondly, is it possible...I...I mean it's not impossible that something happened to this kid, that he was abused either by family or someone else who said, you know ah, that said he was a priest or that said he was me.

McCarthy But...

Fr. Magaldi Does he recognize...

McCarthy But he specifically says...yes, he said he would, and he specifically says that ah, he saw the collar, that this was not a one time event, that this took place over a number of years.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah.

McCarthy And that he could identify you in a minute.

Fr. Magaldi Has he been shown pictures of me.

McCarthy No.

Fr. Magaldi There was a picture of me in the newspaper.

McCarthy Yes. No, because if I...

Fr. Magaldi Because I would be interested in having four or five pictures put in a line up and see if he can pick me out.

McCarthy I have already made a total array of twelve individuals in which you're one of the twelve.

Fr. Magaldi Ah ha. In a collar?

McCarthy All similar visions of the collar...

Fr. Magaldi Yeah.

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McCarthy ...face, hair, etc.

Fr. Magaldi Okay, because there are a couple of priests in the Diocese unfortunately who (inaudible words)

McCarthy With him being hospitalized at this point it's not the time...

Fr. Magaldi No, no no.

McCarthy ...to show that.

Fr. Magaldi That's not...I just wondered about that.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi Cause even to remember my name like that. I mean did he...is it possible that he really remembered my name or did that...seeing that article

(inaudible word) or did somebody prompt him. Is somebody behind this?
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Like I would not deny (inaudible words).

McCarthy He's quite emphatic that it's you.

Fr. Magaldi That's well that's fine. He can be as emphatic as he wants to be.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi Cause I'm just as emphatic saying I do not know the man.

McCarthy Would...could somebody use your name?

Fr. Magaldi Why not?

McCarthy Would that be another cleric?

Fr. Magaldi It could be. I told you...that's what I started to tell you. When I went to ah, when Bishop Delaney, not Bishop Delaney...Bishop Gelineau sent me to San Antonio to study Spanish.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

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Fr. Magaldi So that I would be out of here when they were doing the investigation ah,
Peat Marwick and (inaudible word) whatever that Company's...

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi ...name is okay. All right. That's when they came up with the conclusion
that I had intermingled funds, like I just...I had started to tell you I was...is
this gonna make the tape run way over (inaudible words)

McCarthy Don't worry about it.

Fr. Magaldi All right. The...wher) for example gave me a check for ten
thousand dollars made out to me and I put it in the Church or used it, that
was considered intermingling funds that were my own, cause supposedly

it was given to me.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi On a couple of other occasions when I needed money I went to the
Industrial Bank where one of my parishioners, I don't know if I'm suppose
to name people or (inaudible words)

McCarthy Yeah, but...but my point again, Father, is this, what does that have to do
with .?

Fr. Magaldi It has nothing to do with , but what I'm trying to tell you...what I want
just to clarify what happened to me where stuff like this came in the mail
to two different Bishops from...one from Chicago and one from...mailed
from Chicago and one from Dallas. You...you will not believe.

McCarthy What stuff came from Dallas?

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Fr. Magaldi There was...ah, I'm getting to that. When the Diocese said that I had intermingled funds, okay, that I had used my own money for Church things, but I had also had money given to the Church that I put in my own account that I used to write checks to...you know, to pay bills from the Church. That was called intermingling, not embezzlement.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi While I was in San Antonio the Pas...the priest that was in my place uhm, I think it was Father Cardente, one morning at six o'clock heard noise downstairs, and he went down to the basement and found in the counting room with the open safe and money around one of my most trusted employees, one of the boys that I had taken on vacation on an occasion.

McCarthy Uhm hmmm

Fr. Magaldi With his hands in the money. Now, the thing is he had a key to the Rectory.

McCarthy Uhm hmmm

Fr. Magaldi He had the combination to the safe because he was like my head, my head usher and I needed someone...well, we had that crazy seat money which I don't think they do it anymore.

McCarthy Nope. But what does that have to do with ?

Fr. Magaldi Well, wait a minute. Wait!

McCarthy Sure.

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Fr. Magaldi: What I'm trying to tell you is that ah, what happened at...at...at that point they went to the police, and now the State got involved, the Attorney General's Office and decided to have a whole big ah, investigation, during which, and I didn't know this until the discovery material came to me, they found that that young man had a hundred thousand dollars in three different bank books out of the State. Okay? They also concluded that we were not in cahoots or anything like that. I cannot believe that he could take that kind of money from dollar bills in the thing. I said...I said maybe he was dealing with drugs or something. I don't know. That's beside the point. At that...just after that time I had met the Archbishop of San Antonio and he ah, you know, we were talking in the hall and...and he said come...come and visit me in my office, and I did, and I...I told him all about that. He said you don't have to tell anybody about that stuff. I said fine, I said, but I'm a little apprehensive that I've had only three months of book knowledge of Spanish. I need some practice, and he said, Father, there's no better way to...place to practice than San Antonio. And I looked at him and I said, well how could I do that. He said, do you want me to call Bishop Gelineau? I said, well sure. So he called Bishop Gelineau and asked if I could stay there another year, and Bishop Gelineau said fine, which was also for him an out, because he didn't know what he was gonna do with me when I came back in August, because of the publicity from VonBulow and all this other stuff. Okay? To make a long story short, that was in August or September. In December the

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Archbishop calls me to go down to have breakfast with him one morning, and when I'm there he takes out a packet that he had received, postmarked Chicago, with clippings of everything that had happened up here, clippings from the Providence paper, with that ah, thing that had passed out too, all of this kind of stuff.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi And a letter saying that I was a pathological liar, that I was a danger to the

Church, that I was going to...he said...he said that I was capable of destroying the Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, which was kind of ridiculous. Christ said that even the gates of hell couldn't do it. How was

going to do it. But the point was those letters said that I was a thief, a pathological liar, a person needing psychiatric care, and it said...the last thing said is if you incardinate Magaldi into your Diocese, you'll be looking for trouble. He looked at me and he said, Father, a Priest wrote this. I said I can't believe it. I...I don't have any enemies as Priests that I know or how could a Priest do it? And he said, nobody uses the word

incardination in lay...lay terms.

McCarthy Hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Or something like that. So he said you better go back to Rhode Island and get this straightened out. Okay. So now when I...I know once again it has nothing to do with

McCarthy Yup.

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Fr. Magaldi Ah, when I came back ah...oh, before I came back, Bishop Gelineau called me. He said you know you've been through a lot of stress. Ah, ah, you should really go for a little rest. He said how about

I said that's for people that have had psychological problems; alcoholics, drug addicts, child molesters. I said I don't need to go there. He said well they have a very good program of evaluation for five days and then they determine whether or not ah, you should stay there. I said well fine if that's gonna show that I...I...ah, my head is okay, I'm happy to go. So now in the meantime...I don't know...I'm really giving you too much stuff.

McCarthy Did you go?

Fr. Magaldi I did go. I did go.

McCarthy And what was the result?

Fr. Magaldi The result was I have a great capacity for stress, that I was not a homosexual that I uhm, that I acted more with my heart than with my head, uhm.

McCarthy When did that occur, that evaluation?

Fr. Magaldi That was in 19...let me see. It was '88 when I went down there. It was either 1989 or 1990.

McCarthy Do you remember when?

Fr. Magaldi The exact date?

McCarthy Or the month.

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Fr. Magaldi Uhm, it was just after Easter, because I had had the... I went to Rome in the meantime, cause I went to see a friend of mine in Rome to see what I could do about all this stuff. He ended up having me go to see the Apostolic Delegate in Washington, Laghi was at the time there, both of whom said that there was nothing wrong with my head and that the best thing to do would be to get out of Providence, because there was no way that I was gonna get involved...be able to be here without being bothered by press and all that kind of stuff. But at that same time Laghi suggested that I go talk to another Bishop. So he said do you know any other Bishops? I said yeah, well Bishop Delaney is my classmate from Rome I said, but I...you know...I'm ashamed to tell him about this business that went on in the Parish and all that and the money. And he said, well what about Favalora. And I said Favalora, he was in the year behind me. He's now the Archbishop of Miami, but at that time he was being made...he was Auxiliary in ah, Louisiana I think and he was going to Tampa, Florida, and the Archbishop want on. He said I'm going down to install him next week. I will tell...tell uhm, him about you. I said that's wonderful, thank you, Archbishop. So, the next week I get a call from Washington, and he says, mission accomplished. He said I talked to Favalora. He'll be calling you. So now Favalora five minutes later is calling me, and he...we use to be very good friends, and he...Magaldi! He says only you could get into all of this mess. He said why don't you come down and see me. So I only told Bishop Gelineau that I was going to uhm, Tampa to visit him, right.

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I went down there and we...we spent a few days together. I told him the whole story. I brought him a copy of all that stuff.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Which incidentally I had an investigator, named ah...Oh God I can't even remember his name...in Georgia who use to do things...they came up with the...the blood type of the person that typed, the kind of typewriter and all that. We could never figure out who it was that did that. Anyway, to make a long story short, he had just gotten into this Diocese, and already one of the Parishes was suing the Diocese over a Priest who had been...had died who supposedly had put money from the Church into

his own account
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McCarthy This is in Tampa?

Fr. Magaldi Yes, and so this...this now was almost similar to what my problem was. He was afraid about taking me in, because he said he would put it before the Personnel Board. I came back to Providence. He, three days later, called me and said guess what I got in the mail. He got the exact same package of hate mail with clippings and everything. Only this one wasn't mailed from Chicago. It was mailed from Dallas. And complete confusion (inaudible words) well anybody who's traveling can go drop the thing in the mail or have somebody else do it. But, the...in addition to that statement on...I mean that letter at the bottom it said, ask Magaldi why he was thrown out of San Antonio, that they found a Sunday collection from the Parish he was in in his car. That was an absolute lie. Ah, he's now

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Judge...att ah, Dimitri, Bill Dimitri was my Attorney. He had an affidavit signed down in Texas by the Pastor that I never had dealings with money, that there was no such truth.

McCarthy But if I could interject this, Father, what does that have to do with allegations?

Fr. Magaldi What it has to do me...is that someone has been out to get me for a long time, and I don't think it's impossible that that person may have...

McCarthy You're saying that is a part of this

Fr. Magaldi It's not , but somehow there might be some connection between these people and him, feeding him this information. Okay. That

ah, ah, I don't know, but that's my own.

McCarthy But allegation has...the only thing he brings up in money is that you paid him.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, right!

McCarthy But his main allegation is not whether money is misappropriated or not.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah

McCarthy His allegation is that he was sexually assaulted.

Fr. Magaldi Fine, okay.

McCarthy And that he also says that in these sexual assaults, and he says specifically if anybody ever mentions a complaint regarding Father Magaldi and enemas, you better take it serious, cause he said he has this thing about that.

Fr. Magaldi Okay, well I'm sorry, I have to deny that.

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McCarthy And this is what the guy in Texas alleges also, right?

Fr. Magaldi Yes, right, but, you can see that it's not...

McCarthy And he went to Bishop Delaney because the guy felt...

Fr. Magaldi The guy in Texas did not allege that I had any sexual misconduct with him.

McCarthy Why was he motivated to talk to Bishop Delaney about that?

Fr. Magaldi Because he went to Confession to someone that it was bothering him I guess about the enemas and stuff like that.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Or ah, the so-called kiss of good luck and take care.

McCarthy Tell me, do you think ah, in your opinion that was taken out of context then?

Fr. Magaldi Yes, definitely.

McCarthy Do you think that would be confusing behavior that he would not know how to interpret it one way or the other?

Fr. Magaldi How do you mean?

McCarthy In other words there's some behavior and there's some conversation that you know is definitely bad.

Fr. Magaldi I don't believe...

McCarthy There's behavior and conversation that's definitely good, but there's that behavior and conversation that's in the middle that can go either way, that this was confusing behavior for him; the kiss on the cheek, the enema and everything else.

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Fr. Magaldi I don't believe the enema was a confusing behavior. I don't think that was his allegation at all.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi I think it was his...the embrace, the hug that I gave him before he left the hotel.

McCarthy And you're saying that was a cultural thing?

Fr. Magaldi Ah, cultural? I mean it was a...it was a normal...we...every...na I shouldn't say every...we all hug. That's one of the biggest things, the Priests, we all like at the Sign of Peace and we don't just shake hands. I know now we're told don't do it. Don't initiate a hug, because somebody...

McCarthy Could somebody misinterpret that?

Fr. Magaldi It could be misinterpreted, yes.

McCarthy And you're saying?

Fr. Magaldi I feel that he misinterpreted that, because even after that he wrote...I have some letters at home that he had sent to me.

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi With no mention of any problem at all, grateful for this, that and the other thing, and that was the last thing...

McCarthy How did you come to meet him?

Fr. Magaldi Please?

McCarthy How did you come to meet him?

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Fr. Magaldi He came to .he was in the next Parish, and he came to Confession at... one week. And then he came to Mass, and in recognizing him I, you know, I just...

McCarthy How did...how did you recognize him if he was in the Confessional?

Fr. Magaldi Well because we have face-to-face Confession over there.

McCarthy Okay.

Fr. Magaldi They have a choice of going behind a screen, but...

McCarthy Okay.

Fr. Magaldi ...he did not do that.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi And he seemed to look to me for advice and counseling. He was going to
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he was gonna leave Texas to go to and I

had been from originally born there and all. It was just a natural you know, we had...we went to dinner a few times. He came over to visit at the apartment where my mother and I were.

McCarthy How old was he?

Fr. Magaldi I think he was twen...I think he was ah, twenty or twenty-one.

McCarthy When he

Fr. Magaldi Please?

McCarthy When

Fr. Magaldi Ah.

McCarthy How old was when he made first contact?

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Fr. Magaldi Maybe he was eighteen or nineteen. Okay. Ah, I don't remember if he was uhm, I know he, well he had to get in the first year of college, and normally during in the first year of college you're around eighteen or nineteen. I don't honestly remember the exact age. Okay. Ah, I don't remember if he had been out of school working for a year or something. I...I honestly, I'm sorry I don't remember that.

McCarthy What...getting back to what would have to gain by this if he's to be believed?

Fr. Magaldi What he has to gain?

McCarthy Uhm hmm.

Fr. Magaldi Well if it's...if it's...he's looking for money...he wants money.

McCarthy No, he didn't say that.

Fr. Magaldi No, he didn't say in there he wants to have ah...

McCarthy He said two things.

Fr. Magaldi The support.

McCarthy He wants...

Fr. Magaldi Or to put closure to all of this.

McCarthy Closure.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy To the incidents.

Fr. Magaldi All right, fine.

McCarthy Get back with _____

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Fr. Magaldi Well that's...that's something that has to be between _____

McCarthy And...

Fr. Magaldi ...right?

McCarthy Correct.

Fr. Magaldi This is not my...

McCarthy But she's...

Fr. Magaldi Does she know (inaudible words) discuss this with

McCarthy Yes, he...that's what he told me. He alleges that in discussions with

until he deals with all of this stuff.

Fr. Magaldi Ah ha.

McCarthy And that is a tremendous motivator he says for him.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, I can understand that.

McCarthy And he says his other main reason is so that this doesn't happen to anybody else who goes through what he went through. And he said ah, other than that he said I really don't have anything. If I'm entitled to anything, but I'm not looking to sue anybody.

Fr. Magaldi That's fine.

McCarthy He said, all I'm looking to do is to get my life back on track.

Fr. Magaldi Okay.

McCarthy Now...

Fr. Magaldi But haven't all the other people who have brought suits against Priests, even in Dallas and all, hasn't that been one of their so-called statements; that they want to make sure that this doesn't to anybody else.

McCarthy Not all, but quite a few.

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Fr. Magaldi Okay, I understand that. But what I need to know, like from a psychiatrist, is it possible that I...he called me a predator in that thing.

McCarthy That's correct.

Fr. Magaldi Which is a very offensive and...and...and hurtful thing.

McCarthy It is an offensive word.

Fr. Magaldi Extremely, okay. Cause the point is I...I could turn around and sue him.

McCarthy You could.

Fr. Magaldi For deformation of character, but who wants to have all this in the paper.

I don't need that. I've had enough publicity as it is.

McCarthy Well, as...

Fr. Magaldi The point is...

McCarthy As of this date, from November 2, 1998 until December 30, 1998, almost two months, he has not gone to the press.

Fr. Magaldi Good. But what's to say he won't? What's to say that somebody he's talked to. Is he throwing my name around with other people?

McCarthy At the only people he says he talked with about is a lawyer who he has not identified yet.

Fr. Magaldi Yup.

McCarthy And I specifically said to him that if he has retained the services of counsel, it would be unethical and improper of me to talk with any longer and that I should do everything through his attorney.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hmm.

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McCarthy He says that he hasn't decided if he's going to have that person or someone else.

(END OF TAPE ONE, SIDE TWO)

McCarthy He may not have, he said, anyone. I said that in the event that he does he has my number to contact me, cause that's who I should be talking to. He said to me that he wants to take a polygraph to prove that he is telling the truth. He doesn't care what questions are asked. Ah, he doesn't care where he has to go for it. Now he's the one asking me.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hmm.

McCarthy To take the polygraph.

(hiccup)

Fr. Magaldi Excuse me.

McCarthy Now you...you tell me, Father, that you told the same thing to Bishop Delaney. You wanted to take a polygraph.

Fr. Magaldi Yes, sure.

McCarthy Do you still want to take a polygraph?

Fr. Magaldi Yes I do, but then the question is when can I do this, cause I'm only here for a short time.

McCarthy I understand that. And that's...

Fr. Magaldi I'm gonna have to go spend...

McCarthy This is something I ah, I told the Bishop. I said ah, first of all we have to deal with the holiday season, Christmas and New Year's. We have

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people who are on vacation. I mean you look at the traffic coming in and out of Providence and it's very light.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah.

McCarthy Because if...unless I didn't have a lot of paperwork to...to do I wouldn't even come in.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hmm.

McCarthy Because everybody you call is not in their office.

Fr. Magaldi Right.

McCarthy So, all of the polygraph examiners aren't just waiting for me to call. They're all busy on other things, so it has to be a time when you're available, if I'm available and they're available. But there's a short window of opportunity, because you have to be the Bishop tells me...

Fr. Magaldi (Inaudible words)

McCarthy ...on January 3rd.

Fr. Magaldi Yeah, which is Sunday.

McCarthy Yeah. Are you leaving the 2nd, Saturday?

Fr. Magaldi I'm leaving the 3rd.

McCarthy You're leaving the 3rd.

Fr. Magaldi I have to be there at night. I have to leave in the afternoon of the 3rd. I think it's like two thirty or something, from here in Providence.

McCarthy How long are you gonna be down there for?

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Fr. Magaldi Until the 7th, but I have the flight is going back from Washington to Dallas on the 7th. I'm not coming back this way. Is there any possibility that one

of these people could see me? If not...I suppose today is too much of a rush. Tomorrow's New Year's Eve. In the day time I could manage to get up.

McCarthy See the dilemma...the dilemma is this. It may be for you but not for them, and...with the holiday season. And ah...

Fr. Magaldi Can I do this...I can't do this in Texas?

McCarthy I don't see a problem why you can't either. That's gonna be my next point. My next point is I don't have a problem with you coming back here or sending somebody here from down there, or using somebody down there that they feel comfortable with. I don't have a problem with that either. I think that's a call by Bishop Delaney.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hhm.

McCarthy Ah, because we want to accommodate you people, but I think it's important to point out that you're not incardinated here in the Diocese of Providence.

Fr. Magaldi Right.

McCarthy You are in Fort Worth.

Fr. Magaldi Right.

McCarthy And Bishop Delaney has asked Bishop Mulvee could we assist him because the complainant is here.

Fr. Magaldi Uhm hhm.

McCarthy And ah...

Fr. Magaldi I don't even know Bishop Mulvee either. I want to (inaudible words)

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McCarthy Bishop Mulvee is the new Ordinary...

Fr. Magaldi I know who he is, but I mean I don't know him personally.

McCarthy Yeah.

Fr. Magaldi Gelineau is another story.

McCarthy Yup.

Fr. Magaldi I know him very well.

McCarthy Mulvee said by all means, and ah, we conducted the initial interview and the basic documentation and tracking of the complaint.
