Dear Bishop Delaney,

I pray that this letter finds you well, and that the peace of Christ may continue to accompany you and the people of God of the diocese of Ft. Worth.

Bishop, I am a \_\_\_\_\_, member of the \_\_\_\_\_

I am also a native of \_\_\_\_\_ although now my folks have moved to \_\_\_\_\_. My reason for writing is a somewhat sensitive matter, but in a recent conversation with \_\_\_\_\_ he and I decided it would be prudent to write this letter to you.

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I do not know if the matter has yet come to your attention, but I and other young men were sexually harrassed/abused by Msgr. James Reilly, who was my pastor while growing up in \_\_\_\_\_. I know for sure that another friend of mine was also abused during the years that we served as altar boys and eucharistic ministers (he and I shared our "stories" years later while in college). I also heard during those years of other questionable actions of Msgr. Reilly.

Bishop, I know that these problems are plaguing the Church in the \_\_\_\_\_ states \_\_\_\_\_, and in no way am I trying to add to the problem. The problem is already here, and I know that it is important for us to acknowledge it and seek ways to heal our broken body, the Church. I personally do not have a need, at least at this point, to go any further with this particular situation than writing this letter and letting you know of what happened. My greater concern is for the others whom I suspect may be suffering far more than I because of Msgr. Reilly's sickness. There may already be others who have called your attention to the situation that we lived through at \_\_\_\_\_ during those years. If that is the case, then I hope that the correct steps are being taken to help those who were hurt to find healing. I also hope that Msgr. Reilly is

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given the chance to seek counselling and healing for his problems. Even though he abused his authority and power as our pastor, I still know that he is a man who, with all of his limitations, tried to serve God and God's people. I do not want Msgr. Reilly to be destroyed by a big public ordeal, but it is necessary to assure that he not be allowed to hurt others (I don't even know if he is still alive).

I might add that my friend and I, after we discovered that we both had been victims of Msgr.'s abuses, went to talk with Msgr. and to tell him that we did not want those things to happen anymore. Msgr. Reilly was visibly shaken by our bringing up the subject, but as I remember, he never really acknowledged any wrong doing. That confrontation happened around 1979-80.

Thank you, Bishop, for hearing me out. I know that this only adds burden to your heavy load as shepherd, but both of us are called to speak the Truth and protect the vulnerable. Please know that I hold you, Msgr. Reilly and any other victims of sexual/clergy abuse up before the merciful love of God. Please pray for me and others who may need inner healing from painful experiences of the past. I reiterate that, other than an acknowledgement that you had received my letter, I have no more to say. For the moment, I do not go further in this case.

May God's mercy and peace fill all of us with the abundant life that Jesus so graciously offered.

I am enclosing a copy of a letter I have just received from [redacted]. He is not very specific about his allegations, but I truly don't want to write him for more details since he seems to be willing to let it go by simply informing me. I am assuming that what happened was along the lines of the previous case that involved allegations made against you a couple of years ago.

In any case, following the agreement that the bishops of the U.S. have reached, I feel I must share with the church in Philadelphia. I deeply regret this because it may be the cause of further pain to you, but it is necessary. The problem we are dealing with here is causing devastation across the country - particularly in Dallas at the moment - and I am compelled to take every proper action to protect the people of the Church as well as the good name of the Church.

I promise to keep you in my prayers.

Your recent letter certainly brought sad news, but I am very grateful to you for writing to me to tell me about your own experiences with Monsignor James Reilly. I am truly sorry that this happened to you and I am glad that it has not been a source of continuing problems.

A couple of years ago, after Msgr. Reilly had left the diocese, I heard something to something having happened in the past, probably similar to what you experienced. The circumstances made it impossible to find out anything factual. Yours is the first concrete report about misconduct with young people.

Msgr. Reilly retired from active ministry five years ago and after living a couple years in Dallas, returned to Philadelphia to be near [redacted]. Although he is in somewhat frail health, he is living in a rectory there and, I assume, helping on weekends in the parish. I have sent a copy of your letter to him and, because of the responsibility I have to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, I have informed the officials there of your letter.

During the next few weeks I will try to make contact with [redacted] to give him a chance to talk about what he remembers, and to be sure that he is doing all right.

I can imagine that it was very difficult for you to write about this, but you did the right thing and I am grateful to you and [redacted] for suggesting it. Be sure that I will keep you in my prayers. If you ever have the chance, I would like to meet you when you are up this way.

In re: Monsignor James Reilly

1. I received a call on August 13 from JR in answer to my letter to him with the copy of the letter from [redacted]. He insisted she had never done anything improper and that he had always been on the very best terms with [redacted]. He was very distressed by the letter and by the difficulty that it could cause in Philadelphia. I shared with him my knowledge of accusations made by the former cher at the parish without revealing the source, and some unconfirmed suggestions I had heard. He was shocked and denying. He began to talk about coming back to Fort Worth if he was forced to leave Philadelphia and would there be a place for him here. I assured that I would help him if that was necessary.

2. I received a call on August 15 from Father Frank Mallone, chancellor of the diocese of Little Rock, a friend of JR for many years, who had just spoken by phone with JR and was concerned by how depressed JR was because of my letter, etc. He assured me that in all the years he had known JR that nothing untoward had ever happened. I said he couldn't believe that JR would ever have done anything improper. He then guardedly told him of other accusations and insinuations that I knew of. He said that he had no choice but to act (he is in charge of misconduct in his diocese), but he hoped that JR was innocent.

3. Today I called Father William Lynn (215/551-4532), secretary for clergy in Philadelphia to follow up on a brief letter that RWW had written him last week with a copy of [redacted] letter. I wanted to give some context to the affair. We had a long talk and I explained that I didn't think that JR was a threat to anyone. He was glad of the background so he could explain the matter more clearly to the cardinal.

4. Today I called JR to tell him I had called Lynn. He is upset and worried.

Bishop Delaney received a letter from \_\_\_\_\_ dated July 19, 1994, describing sexual advances made to him by Msgr. Reilly when \_\_\_\_\_ was about 16 years of age, he is now about 30 years old. \_\_\_\_\_ did not want to go any further than inform Bishop Delaney about what took place; he did not ask that any action be taken against Msgr. Reilly.

Bishop Delaney sent a copy of that letter with a covering letter to Msgr. Reilly on August 9, 1994. Msgr. Reilly called Bishop Delaney on August 15. Bishop Delaney said he would be sending a copy of the letter to the Archdiocesan Office in Philadelphia; an agreement the bishops in the U.S. have with one another, to inform one another of allegations. He said he did not intend to go any further since \_\_\_\_\_ did not want \_\_\_\_\_ either.

On August 12, 1994 Fr. Wilson sent a copy of \_\_\_\_\_ letter to Fr. William J. Lynn, secretary for clergy in Philadelphia, with a covering letter indicating he was doing this at the request of Bishop Delaney. Bishop Delaney spoke to Fr. Lynn on the phone before the latter had received the letter. Fr. Lynn said he would tell the Cardinal Archbishop about it when he received the letter.

Msgr. Reilly called Bishop Delaney for the second time, on August 13, said he had talked to Fr. Frank Malone in Little Rock, AR, to Fr. Richard Flores and Fr. Joseph Scallin in Ft. Worth.

Msgr. Reilly called Fr. Wilson and Fr. Schumacher on August 23. He told the latter he had called \_\_\_\_\_ who would vindicate him and his actions that he had not intended nor done anything of a sexual nature with either \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_. He had asked JAS to talk to \_\_\_\_\_ to verify this.

Fr. Wilson tried to contact \_\_\_\_\_, got \_\_\_\_\_ on the phone and just left his name with no details.

Fr. Jim Miller called JAS, August 24, and made an appointment for the next day. On August 25,

Fr. Miller, as \_\_\_\_\_ pastor, had been approached by \_\_\_\_\_ said he did not know Fr. Schumacher and was apprehensive about approaching him, but would tell Fr. Miller the story.

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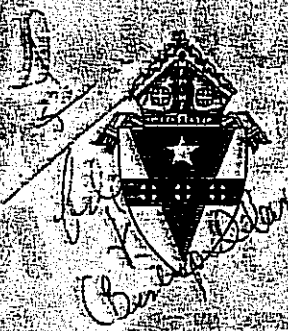
He said to Fr. Miller who repeated it to Fr. Schumacher that Msgr. Reilly had embraced him, kissed him, French-kissed him, and tried to get him to take his clothes off when [redacted] was about 16, in high school. [redacted] refused to do so and did not go back to Msgr. Reilly's company after that. When [redacted] was in college with [redacted] comparing notes, they told each other what had happened to each. [redacted] and [redacted] then went to Msgr. Reilly and together told him not to ever do to others what he had done and tried to do to them. Msgr. Reilly apologized and said he would not. Months later [redacted] asked [redacted] if Msgr. had done this to him; [redacted] said he had not. [redacted] then asked [redacted] who said that Msgr. had done and tried to do the same to him. [redacted] said he didn't want to go any further with it, had it all back in his mind and wanted to forget it. Fr. Miller did say that [redacted] began crying at this point. He asked Fr. Miller to have Fr. Schumacher contact Msgr. and tell the fact that he should not call him any more nor communicate with him in any way. He said [redacted] know about the incident(s). I told Fr. Miller that if [redacted] wanted some counseling, to let us know and we could help provide that. Fr. Miller said he thought he would be the best one to counsel with [redacted] JAS replied that he was thinking of psychotherapeutic counseling with a professional, that Fr. Miller should advise [redacted] of that if [redacted] asked about it or talked to him and more about the incident(s) of the past. Fr. Schumacher called Msgr. Reilly the night of August 25, 1994, told him that he had been in contact with [redacted] who said he did not want Msgr. Reilly calling him or contacting him any more, to leave him alone, that he did not intend to do anything about what had happened to him. Msgr. Reilly said he understood and that he would abide by [redacted] request.

Concern: Conversation with \_\_\_\_\_ about Monsignor James Reilly

I reached \_\_\_\_\_ today at 6:15 PM, after trying unsuccessfully three other times on August and September. I had left my name with \_\_\_\_\_ on the first occasion, but no phone number, saying I would call back. On the second two tries, August 27 and September 10, I chose not to leave a message on an answering machine.

I reported to \_\_\_\_\_ that Monsignor Schumacher had been contacted by Father James Miller, \_\_\_\_\_ pastor, with this request that Monsignor Reilly make no further contact with him. Monsignor Schumacher conveyed that information to Monsignor Reilly. \_\_\_\_\_ told me that no further contacts have been attempted by Monsignor Reilly.

Next I told him that we were concerned for him and wanted to help him find a counselor, and help pay for the counseling if he felt he needed it. He expressed appreciation, but did not feel the need. He spoke with Father Miller on several occasions, and received great help from him. He requested that I commend Father Miller to the bishop.

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He reported that he was very angry with \_\_\_\_\_ whom he considers a close friend, for opening up the issue. He had to work through that anger with Father Miller, as well as his anger at Monsignor Reilly. He had \_\_\_\_\_ of the incidents and so Monsignor Reilly's calls were no surprise. However, Monsignor Reilly also called \_\_\_\_\_ and he had never told them about the incidents. They were in shock one day when he walked into their house just after Monsignor Reilly had called them. They were denying that it could have happened, and he told them that it did, that there was considerable difference between affectionate hugs and \_\_\_\_\_ by Monsignor Reilly with perhaps a chaste kiss and repeated hugs and french kisses. He was also feeling guilty about not having brought it up before because the same thing happened to \_\_\_\_\_.

He says that Father Miller helped him realize that he need feel no shame. He has forgiven Monsignor Reilly, had already forgiven him he says, and now wants to close this chapter.

I requested that he have \_\_\_\_\_ call me if he would like counseling, explaining that I have contacts in that field. I also told him that we wanted to help pay for counseling for \_\_\_\_\_ if he desired it, and should he change his mind, for him.

We hung up with mutual assurances of satisfaction about the communication.



Memorandum to Files  
from Father Robert Wilson

Concern: Complaint about Msgr. James Reilly by

On this date I was called on the phone by \_\_\_\_\_ a clinical psychologist. She explained that she has been appointed by the Diocese of Dallas to act as their intake person for complaints of sexual misconduct. Calls made to the chancery office are turned over to her for first contact.

In this case, that was not the way it worked. She supervises a social worker/therapist who has had \_\_\_\_\_ in therapy sometime. Only recently he revealed that when he was eleven years old, about \_\_\_\_\_ years ago, he was fondled by JR. His therapist knew of \_\_\_\_\_, and referred him to her. She in turn called me. She told me that the alleged sexual abuse happened only once. When I told her that I would like to meet with \_\_\_\_\_ she said \_\_\_\_\_ had given her my name and that of Father Joseph Schumacher. When I heard that both of us are priests he was reluctant to talk to us. However, at her request he called me.

I apologized for the Church and for JR, and asked to meet with \_\_\_\_\_. He explained to me the same thing he had told \_\_\_\_\_ that he did not feel comfortable meeting with me because I am a priest. I then told him of \_\_\_\_\_ membership on the sexual misconduct investigation team. I explained that his role was not the same as \_\_\_\_\_'s, but that it is as close as we have. He agreed to see him. I called \_\_\_\_\_ fill him in on the case, and said that \_\_\_\_\_ would be calling him. I offered \_\_\_\_\_ counseling, and reported that to \_\_\_\_\_. I said that he could continue going to his present therapist, or if he wished, could see \_\_\_\_\_, or a third person altogether, either of his choice or someone recommended by \_\_\_\_\_. I told \_\_\_\_\_ that I would like to see a six month counseling contract with evaluation after the time.

I explained to \_\_\_\_\_ that JR is now in a rest home in Philadelphia, suffering from Alzheimer's Disease, and that if confronted, he would probably not be competent to answer. He asked if we had received any other complaints. I told him of the adult who had complained of a similar incident several years ago, \_\_\_\_\_ and of the fact that JR had denied it, and that she had \_\_\_\_\_ contact with the complainant. I said that \_\_\_\_\_ complaint was far more serious and that we knew of no other similar incidents with minors. I asked if he knew of anyone we should contact. He said no, that it was a long time ago.

At the time I had forgotten about \_\_\_\_\_ who had sent a complaint by letter about sexual misconduct on the part of JR when he, \_\_\_\_\_ was a young man in the parish. I cannot remember the details of that complaint even as I write these notes.

He went a few times, and the diocese paid for the sessions. He called me a few weeks ago wanting more counseling, but was sorry to learn that his original therapist had gone out of business. [redacted] was recommended by [redacted] I have authorized six months of counseling and [redacted] has agreed to send me a diagnosis and prognosis at that time.

Subsequent to my 10-14-98 memo, called me (as my memory kicks in), [redacted] of [redacted] to go for counseling to the person who referred him to [redacted] of [redacted] She is the Counselor [redacted] referred to in line 3 above. [Signature]
