Edward G. Greer; Formerly Taught Drama at SU

Edward G. Greer, a member of the Syracuse University Drama Department faculty from 1974 to 1991, died May 7 at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City. He was 73.

The cause of death was congestive heart failure, said his sister, Marilyn Abrams, of Poughkeepsie.

Arthur Storch, recently retired chairman of the drama department, invited Mr. Greer to join the faculty in 1974. They were both associated with the Actors Studio in New York City, where Mr. Greer was a member of its Directors Unit.

Mr. Greer brought a knowledge of classical acting which he acquired while working with various repertory companies in Stratford-upon-Avon, Liverpool and Birmingham.

In May 1991, the Edward Greer Award for Classical Acting was established at the university.

Mr. Greer was born in Cambridge, Mass., and was a graduate of Harvard University. His graduate study at the Yale School of
